

UPDATED HEARING PROCEDURES

<u>Judge David M. Gormley's</u> Hearing Procedures

The following hearing procedures are currently in effect:

All criminal and civil hearings will be conducted in-person unless otherwise ordered by the Court.

In-custody defendants will appear via Zoom from the Delaware County Jail for pretrial conferences. In-custody defendants will appear inperson for all other hearings, unless otherwise ordered.

Attorneys are required to appear in-person unless otherwise ordered.

Judge James P. Schuck's Hearing Procedures

The following changes to hearing procedures will go into effect on **April 1, 2022**:

All criminal and civil hearings will be conducted in-person unless otherwise ordered by the Court.

In-custody defendants will appear via Zoom from the Delaware County Jail for arraignments and bond hearings. In-custody defendants will appear in-person for all other hearings, unless otherwise ordered.

Attorneys are required to appear in-person for all hearings unless otherwise ordered.

Initial Appearance Docket Procedures:

The initial appearances scheduled at 1:00 p.m. daily before a magistrate will provide for the option for counsel to appear either in-person or via Zoom. In-custody defendants will appear via Zoom from the Delaware County Jail.

Intervention in Lieu Motions-Judge Schuck

Please note that going forward, Judge Schuck will require motions for intervention in lieu of conviction to be filed **no later than 2:30 p.m. on the day prior to the <u>first</u> trial date.** This policy will be reflected in his arraignment entries.

Fingerprint-Photograph-DNA Processing



The Delaware County Sheriff's Office now is processing fingerprints, photographs, and DNA samples here at the courthouse for out-of-custody defendants.

When processing is required, the defendant will report down to the fingerprinting room located on Level 300 in the Adult Court Services lobby immediately following the hearing.

If a defendant is not present in the courtroom for their hearing, he or she can call **740-833-2777** to schedule a time for processing.
